The Apprenticeship Scheme

We are pleased to offer successful candidates the opportunity to follow an Intermediate and Advanced apprenticeship in Sustainable Resource Management.

The management development training programme will take place over three years giving the apprentices exposure to a number of different elements of the huge EMR business, including customer service, commercial skills, weighbridge activities, general yard duties, specialist processes such as vehicle and fridge recycling and material sorting and 'grading' etc. The importance of Health, Safety and Environmental management in the metal recycling industry will also feature heavily throughout the scheme.

Essentially, we're looking to recruit our depot managers of the future and this apprenticeship scheme will provide excellent career prospects to move into other disciplines such as commercial or transport.

All training and assessments will be provided at EMR depots during the apprenticeship programme with no travel to Myerscough College required. Candidates simply need four GCSEs (two of which must be English and Maths A – C grade, with two additional subjects at Grade D or above) a positive attitude towards hard work and an enthusiasm for learning and continually developing as an employee.

The roles will be spread across a number of EMR depots in the UK. All candidates must be 18 or older.
